Terri Edgerton, CIS Director Suzanne Legare Belcher, Field Director</p> <p>Technical assistance LIT visits</p> <p>CSP update mapping process</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • SOC plan identified needs of young children, so Terri (CIS) has joined SIT. • LIT visits: Recently went to Middlebury LIT. Reviewed notes on handout and discussed thoughts about visit. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ How will SIT respond to learning from LITs? Provide feedback during meeting about what stands out, areas of concern, strengths. SIT discuss when issue raises to level that needs more targeted follow up. • CSP update – Began planning for updating the CSP form. Cheryle, Mel & Laurel leading this process (sub-group of SIT), met with small group to plan. Plan to involve broad stakeholder input. LIT Extravaganza 2018 is 30th anniversary of Act 264; this may be good target for having CSP update finalized and rolled out. Consider other tools: One Plan, Family Service Plan, CANS. 	
<p>System of Care Plan Focus</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discussion at Vermont Coalition of Residential Programs • Data Dive from last year about young children in residential 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cheryle attended recent VCORP meeting, they had questions about SOC Plan and Turn the Curve (on residential) work. • Young children: reminded about data & themes from FSD and to consider this info in our work. 45% of children accessing Specialized Childcare are in DCF custody. More families asking to have supported childcare extended. Special Accommodation Grants (1:1 aides for children in childcare settings to prevent expulsion) have seen significant increase; funds expended by Nov of FY; many of these children are in DCF custody. • Wonder about total population need for childcare and how many access childcare. Childcare Subsidy numbers are down compared to prior FY. 	<p>Review early childhood data for consideration for next SOC plan.</p> <p>Cheryle to follow up with Sara Ward about what CWTP modules are available to broader</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review recommendations and chart progress 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 2017 SOC Plan (on IFS website): <p>Goal 1: reinvigorating and resourcing Act 264 statutory mandates. LIT Extravaganza focused on this. Regions have need for support in training locally, how to facilitate CSP meetings. Ask about this at LIT visits. Training PPTs available on IFS website. Reminder that CWTP has online training modules available for anyone.</p> <p>Goal 2: Focus on the number of children and youth in residential placements. Advisory group developed workplan. Meeting with AHS/AOE leadership to discuss workplan and priorities. VFFCMH will be wrapping up their focus group data gathering of family perspective and will get data to SIT/TTC group in early May.</p> <p>Goal 3: Identify and advocate for additional resources in community agencies. S.133 bill pending. Workforce development opportunities discussed.</p> <p>Goal 4: Support payment reform efforts. Healthcare/payment reform efforts now from AHS CO (Mary Kate – Delivery Service Reform group). Reviewing efforts to date, how to move forward with payment reform and away from FFS.</p> <p>Goal 5: Support funding for family and youth partnership. Funding provided by CDD, FSD, DDSD, ADAP, MCH for technical assistance to parent reps (DMH not asked b/c funding for parent reps comes from DMH). AoE is engaging in a separate process related to funding.</p> <p>IFS workgroup focused on youth & family partnership, developed framework (draft). Will bring to AHS leadership. How does AHS support true partnership? Efforts to have youth voice included – planned to attend Youth Development group, but was cancelled twice. Also consider Green Mtn Self Advocates (Max Barrows).</p> <p>Goal 6: Increase collaboration with early childhood service providers and community supports. CIS Director now on SIT. Want to look more at data for this population. Need focus beyond childcare. Roll-out of PCIT & CPP.</p>	<p>audience for workforce development.</p> <p>Following AHS/AOE meeting about turn the curve, will discuss workplan at SIT.</p>
