 Group discussed tackling the three subheadings of the plan (Young Children, School Age, Young Adult Transition) in smaller groups, possibly meeting between the Autism Workgroup meetings. Molly will follow up regarding the subgroups via email. Note: This group discussed not losing sight of the thread that ties all these age groups together – the importance of doing important work at young ages that will be crucial for when children become adults—functional skills is a big part of this thread—inclusive playgrounds lead to inclusive workplaces!

Young Adult Transition:

- Jenny Masterson is identified as a resource for this group to determine what's available currently and processes already in place in Vermont
- o Danielle Parmelee, Neuro OT, is identified as a resource for this group
- Group discussed possible needs assessment, including gathering information from autistic adults, intentionally including nonspeaking

adults. Green Mountain Self Advocates may be a helpful resource as far as planning this assessment.

• School Age:

- Discussion re: ACT 264 process and how it could be used more often and more effectively for children on the spectrum. What is the process now? Maybe the LIT team meetings would be a good place to gather information. Comments included wondering if the ACT 264 process is flexible enough, and how to bring a larger pool of service providers from the community into the meetings. The group discussed the language used in this forum – "service gaps" – is there a better way to capture this?
- The school world and the designated agency/community provider worlds are silo-ed. Families are left to coordinate across these worlds and face barriers to their logistical interactions.
- Group discussed ableism in our culture state level conversations are needed! How can disability become a priority in the state's view?

Young Children:

 Group discussed challenge of resources in serving young children 0-3 who are suspected of ASD. Wait lists for developmental evaluations are growing longer and longer and less professionals are trained in this work.
 A small group on this initiative has been started with Danielle Howes.
 Proposing way to train providers to serve children using evidence-based practices in their natural environments. Melanie Hall, CSHN, would like to join this work.
